INVESTIGATION:

On 9-7-99 CBI Agent Robert Brown received a phone call from an acquaintance by the name of Mike Connors. Connors is a free-lance reporter and a part-time producer of public information shows. Connors told Agent Brown that he had an Internet conversation and a telephone conversation with Dylan Klebold prior to 4-20-99

Agent Brown prepared a memo reference his phone conversation with Mike Connors, which was forwarded to the plumbine Task Force. A copy of that memo is attached to this report.

On 11-16-99 I spoke to Mike Connors on the telephone reference his reported conversations with Dylan Klebold. Connors could not recall an exact date, but stated that his conversations with Dylan Klebold took place on a Saturday approximately one to four weeks prior to 4-20-99. Connors stated that he was in a chat room on his computer. This was a Denver chat room through America On Line. Connors stated that he was viewing personal profiles when he read one that was disturbing. The profile was of Dylan Klebold. The profile read in part that he was a student at Columbine High School, he hated jocks and that he was either anti-religion or anti-Christian, Connors couldn't remember which. The personal quote read that he wanted to kill students at his high school.

Connors stated that he covered the Oklahoma City bombings as a reporter and seeing Klebold's profile concerned him. Connors sent Klebold a personal message and then had a conversation with him on the Internet. Connors told Klebold that he had covered the Oklahoma City Bombings as a reporter. He then asked Klebold why he wanted to kill the students at his high school. Klebold responded by saying that ¼ of the students deserved to die. Connors asked him why. Klebold stated that the students had picked on him and that they were mean and judgmental. Connors stated that he then attempted to explain the impact the Oklahoma City bombings had on the victims, their families and how it ruined so many lives.

that Klebold asked about the press coverage and how the bombing affected people. Connors stated that Klebold also spoke about Eric Harris. Klebold referred to Eric Harris by name and told Connors that he and Harris were lovers. Connors stated that Klebold also sent him photographs of him and Eric Harris through the computer. Connors told me that he thinks the photos were yearbook photos. Connors stated that he still may have the photograph of Dylan Klebold. Connors stated that he gave Dylan Klebold his home phone number and Klebold telephoned him on the same afternoon that they had the Internet conversation. When Klebold telephone him, Connors stated that the name Klebold did appear on his caller ID. Connors stated that during their phone conversation Klebold spoke a lot about his relationship with Eric Harris. Klebold described himself as bi-sexual.

Klebold also asked Connors if he was a Christian. Connors stated "yes." Connors stated that Klebold then "went off on me." Connors stated that Klebold got angry and told Connors that he (Connors) was stupid for being a Christian. Klebold told Connors that the Christians in his high school had been mean to him. Klebold went on to tell Connors that he admired Hitler. Connors stated that Klebold wanted to meet him in person, however, Connors decided against it.

onnors stated that Klebold sent him a couple of messages over the computer wanting to meet but Connors didn't respond. Connors stated that the Internet and phone conversations combine lasted 20 to 30 minutes.

Columbine shooting April 20, 1999

On September 07, 1999, I got a call from an old acquaintance by the name of Mike Connors 303 615-5267. Connors is a freelance reporter and part-time producer of public information shows. Connors was calling for a favor, however I was unable to help him. During our phone conversation he volunteered that he had been "chatting" with Dylan Klebold on the Internet prior to the April 20, 1999 shooting at Columbine. The reason for the chat session, according to Connors was that Connors had just finished a PBS story on the Oklahoma City bombing case and he was on the net talking to others when Klebold entered the chat room with a curious interest in Connors' story.

Connors and Klebold became friendly and exchanged phone numbers. Some time later Klebold called Connors and they talked more about the Oklahoma City bombing. Connors believed that Klebold was gay and was "hitting on Connors".

Connors tells me that he has never told anyone ,particularly law enforcement of his encounter with Klebold. Connors is available for an interview should you wish to talk to him.

If you have someone interview Connors have them see me first as I can provide background on Connors.

Dear sir;

My name is Martin Middleton (not Omar, I am using his email account) and it was a vollunteer ski instructor at the

Winter Park handicap program for eight years. Currently I am working as a youth counselor at the Ramsey County curfew center here in Minnesota. The Deputies at work thought I should contact you regarding what I knew of the attempted bombing.

Five years ago I spent the day skiing with a kid from the Jefferson Co school district. It may have been Dylan, or more likely a friend of Eric and him. The face in my memory doesn't seem to match the face on the TV. This 13 to 14 year old kid spent the day describing the trenchcoat mafia and also explained in detail how the trenchcoat mafia was going to blow-up Columbine high school and that all the jocks were in for a suprise. The more that I challenged him about his means to carry out such a feat the more details he would yield to me. This kid wasn't even in high school yet. So how could I believe that what he was telling me could possibly happen. His claim that the school would be blown up on the Hitlers 110 birthday seemed rediculous. Everything that he told me has been on the news the last few days. He even told me that the attack would be during daylight and that he could get help to bring in the propane tanks before hand. Wherever I was on Hitler's 110 birthday I would here about Columbine High School.

The Winter Park Handicap ski program is now called the National Sports Center for the disabled, and they keep records of all the kids that have skilled with them as well as the vollunteers that provided the lesson.

I thought it important that you know that this plan to blow-up the school was hatched at least 5 years ago, and judging by his thorough explanation of the plot it seems to me that he might have had help from someone older. I thought that this information may help your investigation. He described how the bombs could be made and was adamant that the trenchcoat mafia wasn't just a bunch of lonely depressed kids, but was much larger.

I'm not much of a writer so if you wanted to call me I'd be happy to tell you everything else that I can remember from that day, however it seems that the only info that I have for you is that of the extensive time line and that they had at least another accomplice who's name may be in a filleing cabinet at the NSCD.

DESCRIPTION OF ACTIVITY:

Telephone interview with James (Martin) Middleton.

On 5/10/1999, SA Traver contacted James Middleton at (651)770-1898, base on an E-Mail message he'd sent to the Jefferson County S.O. The E-mail message entailed a meeting between Middleton, and either Harris or Klebold or a friend of Thiers about 4-5 years ago at Winter Park Ski Resort. At which time the youth described shooting and bombing Columbine High School on Hitler's 110th birthday.

NARRATIVE:

- 1. On 5/10/99, SA Traver received at return phone call from James Middleton at the Columbine task force.
- 2. Middleton stated that he had been a volunteer ski instructor at Winter Park, working with the Winter Park Handicap program, which is now the National Sports for the disabled. He was working in 1994 when he encountered who he believed to be Dylan Klebold. Klebold's mother worked with handicapped kids and Dylan had come along during one of these outings.
- 3. Middleton stated that Klebold talked about shooting and bombing Columbine High School, due to the fact he did not care for the elitist mentality of the "jocks", during events like Homecoming and Prom.
- 4. That it was his understanding that Dylan had attempted to commit suicide. That everything that has been discussed on television in reference to propane bombs, putting pipe bombs on propane tanks, the bombs possibly being place earlier in the week, and help from an adult, Dylan spoke about that day.
- 6. Middleton stated that he became argumentative with Klebold, telling him there was a good chance he may be killed if he pursues this endeavor. Klebold was indifferent about

MTCHAEL PROCTOR (PROTECT IDENTITY BY REQUEST), Legal Counsel, Attorney's Office, UNIVERSITY OF ARIZONA (UA), address at Administrative Building, Room 103, UA, Tucson, Arizona, telephone 520-621-3175, was contacted and advised of the identity of the interviewing agent and the purpose of the interview. PROCTOR provided the following information:

PROCTOR requested that his identity be protected because he felt he was technically violating the university's rules concerning the providing of information on students to outside agencies.

There were a total of six (6) COLUMBINE HIGH SCHOOL (CHS) students who had applied to UA this year, one of whom was DYLAN KLEBOLD. PROCTOR had personally reviewed all six of the CHS applications. PROCTOR declined to identify the other five students over the telephone, citing privacy reasons.

Each UA applicant had to write an essay as part of the application process. KLEBOLD's essay discussed his being involved in drama and of a "big production" which he planned for the Spring, 1999. PROCTOR thought in light of the CHS attack in April, 1999, this was an odd statement for KLEBOLD to make.

PROCTOR recalled besides KLEBOLD's application, another CHS student had indicated similar interests and was also involved in the drama department at CHS. This applicant also indicated that a "big production" would take place during the Spring, 1999. PROCTOR did not know whether the two knew each other, but thought it was unusual they used similar phrases in their respective applications. PROCTOR could not recall the name of this student, but knew he was definitely not ERIC HARRIS.

PROCTOR requested if law enforcement investigating the CHS shootings wished to obtain copies of these six applications, that a subpoena be sent directly to him at his above-listed work address. The subpoena should be directed specifically as follows:





A review of this score sheet discovered a total of 13 students had their averages entered in place of new scores, indicating their absence on April 20, 1999.

The bowling teams were comprised of four persons which were self-picked by the students. Eric HARRIS and Dylan KLEBOLD were on the same team, along with Christopher MORRIS and Nate DYKEMAN.

The score sheet, as well as the teacher, indicated HARRIS, KLEBOLD and MORRIS were absent on April 20, 1999. Nathan DYKEMAN was the only person on the team to have bowled that day.

The complete list of students registered as students in Kristine MaCauley's bowling class, from control #2087, is included with this report.

Judith Kelly, 8160 West Baker Avenue, Lakewood, Colorado 80227, telephone number: (303)989-2201, was advised of the identity of the interviewing agent and sergeant and the nature of the interview.

Information was received that Columbine High School counselor, Brad Butts and teacher, Judith Kelly were reportedly concerned about a creative writing paper Dylan Klebold wrote which detailed a planned shooting involving the Trenchcoat Mafia.

Kelly was advised that the above information was received and she voluntarily provided the following information:

Kelly stated that she is an English teacher at Columbine High School and Dylan Klebold was her student for a creative writing class. She advised that Klebold wrote a story for class as part of an assignment given to the students. Kelly reported that it was well written but very disturbing. She stated that she made a copy for the school counselor, Brad Butts and believes she returned it to Klebold after she graded it. She is not sure if she kept a copy which would be at the school. Kelly thought Klebold may have typed it on the school computer located in the Tech Lab. The teacher for the Tech Lab is Rich Long and the Lab Assistant is Peggy Dodd.

Kelly stated that the paper did not mention the Trenchcoat Mafia but remembers that it was about a man arriving in a town with guns who kills the popular type kids. The end of the story portrays this man or implys that this man is a God like figure. Kelly stated it was very well written, "literary and ghastly". She believes it was written in late February or early March of 1999. Kelly discussed the paper with Klebold stating its cruel and disturbing. She advised that Klebold replied that its just a story. She advised him she found it offensive. Kelly also stated she spoke to Klebold's parents at length about him handing in a disturbing story. Kelly stated that they did not seem worried and made a comment about trying to understand kids today. Kelly advised that her classroom is LA-8 (Language and Arts).

In the classroom, SA Lipka located the paper described above in addition to papers written by Eric Harris, Nate Dykeman and Brooks Brown. Upon return to the Command Post, SA Lipka provided these papers, in an evidence bag, to Lead Investigator, Kate Battan, on 05/04/99.

The town, even at 1:00 AM, was still bustling with activity as the man dressed in black walked down the unnty streets. The moon was barely visible, hiding under a shield of clouds, jadding a chill to the atmosphere. What was most recognized about the man was the sound of his footsteps. Behind the conversations noises of the town, not a sound was to be heard from him, except the dark, monotonous footsteps, combined with the jingling of his belt chains striking not only the two visible guns, in their holsters, but the large bowie knife, slung in anticipation of use. The wide-brimmed hat cast a pitch-black shadow of his already dimly lit face. He wore black gloves, with a type of metal spiked-band across the knuckles. A black overcoat covered most of his body, small lines of metal & haif-inch spikes layering upper portions of the shoulders, arms, and back. His boots were newly polished, and didn't look like they had been used much. He carried a black duffel hag in his right hand. He apparently had parked a car nearby, & looked ready for a small war with whoever came across his way. I have never seen anyone take this mad-max approach in the city, especially since the piggies had been called to this part of town for a series of crimes lately. Yet, in the midst of the nightlife in the center of the average-sized town, this man walked, fueled by some untold purpose, what Christians would call evil. The guns slung on his belt & belly appeared to be automatic hand guns, which were draped above rows of magazines & clips. He smoked a thin cigar, and a sweet clovesque scent eminated from his aura. He stood about six feet and four inchespand was strongly built. His face was entirely in shadow, yet even though I was unable to see his expressions. I could feel his anger, cutting that the air like a razor. He seemed to know where he was walking, and he noticed my presence, but paid no attention as he kept walking toward a popular bar. The Watering Hole. He stopped about 30 feet from the door, and waited. "For whom?" I wondered, as I saw them step out. The man in black said nothing, but even at my distance, I could feel his anger growing. "You still wanted a fight huh? I meant not with weapons, I just meant a first fight....cmon put the guns away, Tuckin pussying said the largest prep, his voice quavering as he spoke these works of attempted courage. Other preps could be heard muttering in the backround; "Nice trench coat dude, that's pretty cool there....".... "Dude we were jus messin around the other day chill out man... " ... "I didn't do anything, it was all them!!" ... "cmon man you wouldn't shoot us, were in the middle of a public place..." Yet, the comment I remember the most was uttered from the smallest of the group, obviously a cocky, power hungry prick. "Go afread man! Shoot me!!! I want you to shoot me!! Heheh you wont!! Goddam pressy..." It was faint at first, but grew in intensity and power as I heard the man laugh. This laugh would have made Satan cringe in Hell. For almost half a minute this laugh, spawned from the most powerful place conceiveable, filled the air, and thru the entire town, the entire world. The town activity came to a stop, and all attention was now drawn to this man. One of the preps began to slowly move back. Before I could see a reaction from the preps, the man had dropped his duffel bag, and pulled out one of the pistols with his left hand. Three shots were fired. Three shots hit the largest prep in the head. The shining of the streetlights caused a visible reflection off of the droplets of blood as they flew away from the skull. The blood splatters showered the preps buddies, as they were to paralyzed to run. The next four preps were not executed so systematically, but with more rage from the man's hand cannon than a controlled duty for a soldier. The man unloaded one of the pistols across the fronts of these four innocents, their instantly lifeless bodies dropping with remarkable speed. The shots from that gun were felt just as much as they were heard. He pulled out his other pistol, and without changing a glance, without moving his death-stare from the four other victims to go, aimed the weapon out to the side, and shot about 8 rounds. These bullets moved down what, after he was dead, I made out to be an undercover cop with his gun slung. He then emptied the clip into two more of the preps. Then, instead of reloading & finishing the task, he set down the guns, and pulled out the knife. The blade loomed huge, even in his large grip. I now noticed that one of two still alive was the smallest of the band, who had now wet his pants, and was hyperventilating in fear. The other one tried to lunge at the man, hoping that his football tackling skills would save his life. The man sidestepped, and made two lunging slashes at him. I saw a small trickle of blood cascade out of his belly and splashing onto the concrete. His head_wound was almost as bad, as the shadow formed by the bar's lighting showed blood dripping off his The last one, the smallest one, tried to run. The man quickly reloaded, and shot him tops the lower leg. He instantly fell, and cried in pain. The man then pulled out of the duffel bag what looked to be some type of electronic device. I saw him tweak the dials, and press a button. I heard a faint, yet powerful

explosion, I would have to guess about 6 miles away. Then another one occurred closer. After recalling the night many times, I finally understood that these were diversions, to attract the cops. The last prep was bawling & trying to crawl away. The man walked up behind him. I remember the sound of the impact well. The man came down with his left hand, right on the prep's head. The metal piece did its work, as I saw his hand get buried about 2 inches into the guy's skull. The man pulled his arm out, and stood, unmoving, for about a minute. The town was utterly still, except for the faint wail of police sirens. The man picked up the bag and his clips, and proceeded to walk back the way he came. I was still, as he came my way again. He stopped, and gave me a look I will never forget. If I could face an emotion of god, it would have looked like the man. I not only saw in his face, but also felt eminating from him power, complacence, closure, and godliness. The man smiled, and in that instant, thru no endeavor of my own, I understood his actions.

She is very smart and knows something about what went down. I found her upset, yesterday in Clement Park, and she intimated that she knew that it might be going down.

Brooks Brown: As I reported to a Lakewood Police-person as the scene, Brooks Brown flagged me down. My passenger was Rick Bath, teacher at CHS. Brooks said that he had seen Eric coming into Columbine carrying a strange duffel bag. Brooks was told to leave the scene to avoid being injured, as he related. I personally believe that he knows much more.

If you contact any of the above; as a courtesy, I am requesting that you leave my name out of your contact. The students will stop trusting me and I will be unable to provide you with additional information.

Interview with Robert Kirgis.

SYNOPSIS:

On April 27, 1999, at approximately 6:30 pm, S/A's Gary R. Wurm and Matt Traver, ATF, interviewed Robert Kirgis at his residence which is 2901 West Centennial Drive, Apt. 2206, Littleton, Colorado, 80123. Mr. Kirgis currently has no home telephone. Mr. Kirgis is a white male, DOB: 05-24-70, SSN: 523-55-7221. He currently is employed as a manager in training at Dominos Pizza, 3920 South Broadway, Littleton, Colorado, telephone number 303-781-6647.

NARRATIVE:

- 1. Mr. Kirgis stated that he had been the owner of Blackjack Pizza, 6657 West Ottawa Place, Littleton, Colorado, from December 1, 1995 until March 8, 1999. He stated that he sold the Blackjack Pizza for about \$15,000. to Chris Lau. He also stated that during his ownership of this Blackjack Pizza, he had employed Eric Harris, Dylan Klebold and Chris Morris. He stated that he had been introduced to Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold by Chris Morris, who had been employed at the Blackjack Pizza for a period of about 2 1/2 years. He further stated that Eric Harris had been at Blackjack Pizza for about 2 years and Dylan Klebold was employed, off and on, for a total of about 1 year. He stated that Harris, Klebold, and Morris had assisted in the making of pizzas for him. He also stated that by were basically good employees.
 - 2. Mr. Kirgis stated that he wanted Agents Wurm and Traver to know that he had been interviewed by a male interviewer with Inside Edition on April 22, 1999 and further that

his interview had been televised on Friday, April, 23, 1999. Mr. Kirgis stated that he had given the interview at Normandy Park, since he was no longer associated with Blackjack Pizza and did not want the interview to show the Blackjack Pizza location. Mr. Kirgis stated that he had previous information about Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold and this information was given during the interview with Inside Edition. Mr. Kirgis provided the following telephone number as a contact number for Inside Edition, 1-800-690-8742. He stated that he could not remember the name of the person who had done the interview with him.

3. Mr. Kirgis stated that the information that he possessed related to when Eric Harris had brought a "small pipe bomb" into the Blackjack Pizza around July 4th, about two years ago. He described the pipe bomb as being shiny and probably made from pipe that is used for plumbing. Mr. Kirgis stated that Eric Harris carried the pipe bomb into Blackjack Pizza through the back door. He stated that he was not scared of Eric Harris, because Harris was not threatening. He stated that Eric Harris just seemed like any other teenage boy. Mr. Kirgis stated that he instructed Eric Harris to take the pipe bomb out of the Blackjack Pizza, which Harris did. Mr. Kirgis does not know what happened to the pipe bomb. He stated that he never heard Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold talk about bombs again nor did they bring any into the pizza shop again. Mr. Kirgis stated that he did light fireworks, of various kinds, behind the pizza shop with Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold.

Mr. Kirgis stated that Eric Harris, Dylan Klebold and Chris Morris usually came into the Blackjack Pizza for their lunch breaks from school about 11:05 am 11:10 am. He stated that they would usually have pizza or a salad. He also stated that Chris Morris had recently gotten a girlfriend and so he wasn't hanging around the shop as much. He also stated that these three boys were kind of like a "click" but added that at one point, a lot of kids were involved with Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold. Mr. Kirgis stated that Charles Phillips, Nathan Dykeman, and Zack Heckler all worked at Blackjack Pizza at one time or another and they all hung out with Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold. Mr. Kirgis added, "most of my employees came from that group".

- 5. Mr. Kirgis stated that Chris Morris seemed like a "mean kid". He further stated that Chris Morris seemed more emotional and he would tell you exactly what was on his mind. Mr. Kirgis stated that he believed that Chris Morris' father was a doctor or surgeon and his father seemed to be hard on Chris Morris. Mr. Kirgis also stated that Chris Morris was one of the smartest kids he had met. He stated that he believed that Chris Morris was not the type of person that was a leader, but he could have been. He stated that he also believed that Chris Morris was separating himself from the group known as the Trench Coat Mafia. Mr. Kirgis stated that he never saw anyone as being the leader of this group. Mr Kirgis stated that about every time he saw this group, they were wearing their "trenches" (trench coats)
- 6. Mr. Kirgis stated that what he has seen on television, since the shooting at Columbine High School, is entirely different from what he saw of Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold at work. He stated that his six year old daughter was around these boys and they treated her very well and she liked them. Mr. Kirgis stated that he even saw Eric Harris Paring a sports type jacket, maybe like a Colorado University jacket.
- .. Mr. Kirgis stated that at various times he and these boys messed around the roof above the Blackjack Pizza at which time they shot off bottle rockets. Mr. Kirgis stated that he mostly just drank beer on the roof. He also stated that Eric Harris and Dylan

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Klebold were not drinkers but probably would have had a drink at a party.

- 8. Mr. Kirgis stated that Billy Dow was a former employee who now works at the Blackjack Pizza located on Simms Boulevard close to the intersection of Simms and Bowles. He stated that Billy Dow would have information of a reported dry ice bomb that was set off behind the Blackjack Pizza that Mr. Kirgis previously owned. He stated that the Jefferson County Sheriff's Department was called when this dry ice bomb was set off.
- 9. Mr. Kirgis stated that he did hear Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold mention about how "jocks" were picking on them. He also related that one time, behind the pizza shop, the Trench Coat Mafia was waiting for a fight with some other persons, but he was not sure with whom. Mr. Kirgis stated that he remembered that Dylan Klebold and Nathan Dykeman were there for the fight.
- 10. Mr Kirgis then stated that on the day of the shooting at Columbine High School, he was taking his daughter to school at Powderhorn Elementary School when he heard about the shooting. This would have been between 11:15 pm 12:15 pm. Mr Kirgis stated that because of a "gut" feeling and the previous knowledge of the pipe bomb, he dalled 911 from the office at Powderhorn Elementary. He stated that the news reports mentioned tranch coats and pipe bombs, so he wanted to alert authorities about Eric Harris, Dylan Klebold i Chris Morris. Mr. Kirgis stated that he gave the dispatcher his name as the reporting son.
- 11. Mr. Kirgis was also asked about his knowledge of the legality relating to pipe bombs and he stated that he was not aware of how illegal they were. He stated that he knew very little about firearms and he just did not think about how illegal the pipe bombs might be He stated that he just did not see an aggressive side of Eric Harris Mr. Kirgis stated that he dose not like explosives, only fireworks.

Synopsis:

On the above date, Denver Police Department Detective Jeff Ruetz and this reporting supervisor interviewed Robert KIRGIS. He was asked several questions relating to his knowledge of the Columbine High School incident of 04-20-99, and his personal and working relationship with subjects of this investigation, namely Eric Harris, Dylan Klebold, The Robert Robe

Details:

- 1) On the date of May 3, 1999 at 1320 hours, Denver Police Department Detective Jeff Ruetz and this reporting supervisor met and interviewed one Robert Hossein KIRGIS (05-24-70). This interview took place at Denver Police Headquarters, Vice/Drug Control Bureau interview room. This interview took place subsequent to a telephonic contact made by KIRGIS to this reporting supervisor approximately 1100 hours this date. KIRGIS reported that he had received my business card left at his residence last Friday, and that he had called me on Saturday from his new employment at Dominoes pizza on south Broadway (303.781.6647). KIRGIS then called this date, and related that he had no problem talking with investigators, and that he wanted to set one thing straight from the start; that news reports about a pipebomb being detonated at the Blackjack pizza place on West Ottawa Place was erroneous. That the detonations involved a "dry ice bomb", and not a pipe bomb. KIRGIS then stated that he would meet this reporting supervisor after he dropped off his daughter at school, approximately 1:00 PM.
- 2) KIRGIS responded to Denver Police Headquarters at 1315 hours. Detective Ruetz and this reporting supervisor verified his identity, when KIRGIS proffered his Colorado Operators License. KIRGIS stated that he was the owner/manager of the Blackjack pizza store located at 6657 West Ottawa Place, Littleton, CO. KIRGIS was the owner from 12-01-95 through 03-08-99, when he sold the store to the current owner. Chris Lao. When asked whom he had hired first

he stated that it was Chris Morris. KIRGIS related that Morris was hired approximately six months after another friend of the group, named Charles Phillips. KIRGIS also mentioned that "Kibbz" as Zach Heckler. This stemmed from newspaper reports he had read, mentioning the acronym "Kibbz" on one of Harris' web pages. When asked what characteristics Heckler possessed, KIRGIS related that he "drove like crap." Other employees KIRGIS had hired as he related knew each other well were Harris, Klebold, Phillips, Nathan Dykeman and Brian Sargent.

- 3) When asked what his knowledge was related to explosives and the group, KIRGIS stated that Harris, Morris and Klebold loved fireworks. That they liked to go to Cheyenne, WYO. To purchase many fireworks that were illegal in Colorado. KIRGIS related that this past July 4th weekend. Klebold, Morris and Harris put on a great firework display at the store. KIRGIS also took his daughter Brianna KIRGIS to observe the show. KIRGIS stated that Klebold and Harris were "tied at the hip", and frequently during school lunch hour both of them came to the Blackjack pizza store to ear a free salad and smoke digarettes by the rear door. When asked about a pipebomb being brought into the store. KIRGIS recalled that Harris came in to the Blackjack store through the rear door carrying his usual black brief type bag. Harris then went to the rear storage employee changing area and brought out what appeared to KIRGIS as a pipebomb. According the KIRGIS, Harris stated, "Check out this pipebomb." Harris then said that he wanted to blow it up after work in a watermelon, near the field. The pipebomb was described as metallic colored, metal pipe, with end caps, and about a foot in length. This incident took place when Harris, Klebold, Morris and KIRGIS were working about two years ago. KIRGIS was able to remember that it may have been in April of 1997.
- 4) When asked if it ever occurred to him that the pipebomb was dangerous and illegal, KIRGIS stated, "yea, that's why I sent him out of the store with it, I was worried that he was going to set it off in my store." KIRGIS later said that he was originally going to send Harri9s home, but he needed him at work that night, so Harris came back after he put the pipebomb away in his car. KIRGIS stated that Harris had told him that it was an explosive device, and he knew that it was a pipebomb, based on what he thought a pipebomb was. When asked if he had any experience with any type of pyrotechnic or explosive devices. KIRGIS stated, "only fireworks, they use to set off fireworks all the time." "They" meaning Harris, Klebold and Morris. KIRGIS also related that Harris, Klebold and Morris were, at times, going on top of the roof to light off fireworks. KIRGIS stated that he also, at times, went up there with them. According to KIRGIS, Harris, Morris and Klebold also set off many dry ice bombs atop the roof of the business. Nicki Liston, a former store manager, also told KIRGIS she knew of these occurrences with dry ice bombs. KIRGIS also recalled that the former owner of the Ottawa Place Blackjack pizza store. Randy Pearson, set of a possible dry ice bomb in the store bathroom. This subject, Pearson is the current Blackjack owner/manager of the 5500 South Simms store, where Billy Dao currently works. KIRGIS prefaced these statements with, he worked with them (Harris, Klebold and Morris), but didn't do much with them. When asked why he didn't call the police when he observed the pipebomb, KIRGIS stated that he "didn't want any trouble." He paused and then stated that he "really wasn't sure why, but hindsight being 20/20, I would now."
- 5) KIRGIS knows that Morris had a girlfriend that lives in the 7000 Block of South Pierce Court, and that closer to the time of the Columbine High School incident, Morris seemed to distance himself away from Harris and Klebold. Also, that Harris and Klebold were "very tight." KIRGIS also related that Klebold wore a trenchcoat almost non-stop, and the others only at times. KIRGIS also stated that he hasn't seen Zach

Heckler in about one and one-half years, but that he believed he still "hung out with them."

- 6) KIRGIS recalled a Christmas party in December of 1997 at the residence of Brady Mann(sp), and Jeff Mann(sp), located at 7169 South Webster Street, number. A Ken Williams, who owns "4 U to See" printing, 303.979.5522, shot darts with Harris. The reason this statement was proffered, was because KIRGIS was asked if he ever socialized with any of the subjects. KIRGIS heard Harris, Morris and Klebold talk about the game "Doom", but never guns. KIRGIS also related that Morris seemed a little mean to him, but if he had a problem with you, it was over sooner. Unlike Harris, who seemed to hold a grudge for you. Harris, Morris and Klebold also had told KIRGIS that they got harassed at school because they were nerds.
- 7) KIRGIS admitted to this reporting supervisor that he is an alcoholic, and at times he drank at work, and left Harris in charge while he left the store for any reason. KIRGIS mentioned that he knew Nate Dykeman, but not that well, and also identified Morris and Dykeman from an array of photos shown to him.
- 8) A female subject by the name of Kimberly Carlin, a.k.a. "Kimmy", who lives on Hinsdale Court was actively dating another male party, when she was supposedly dating Harris a short time. KIRGIS denied that Carlin dated Harris, another interview put them together (see DAO interview, 04-29-99). KIRGIS related that Carlin was in the same early morning bowling class with the subjects of this investigation. Carlin quit Blackjack pizza because she didn't get along with fellow employee Michelle Hartzell(sp).
- 9) KIRGIS recalled that approximately one year ago, Harris, Morris and Klebold were set to fight a group of people near the intersection of West Coalmine and South Pierce Streets, behind the shops. As Harris, Klebold and Morris walked there from the Blackjack pizza store donning their trenchcoats, the other group fled.
- 10) Other related items: Billy Dao had related to KIRGIS that Phil Duran "got the machine gun" for Harris and Klebold. When asked about other parties, KIRGIS knew a James Thousbe as a "stoner", and just had a working relationship with him. Zach Heckler quit the Blackjack pizza store after approximately two months. KIRGIS overheard the subjects talk about the Internet, but didn't recall anything specific. Harris was also known to KIRGIS as "Reb". KIRGIS re-iterated that he "felt very comfortable leaving Harris and Motris in charge of the store", while he was away. Motris seemed "really responsible" while in charge of the store. The last time KIRGIS saw all three subjects, Harris, Motris and Klebold was at "The Zone" bar parking lot, about a few weeks ago. KIRGIS also stated that "Kibbz" is Zach Heckler.

This ended the interview, time was 1435 hours.

Synonsis:

On the above date, Denver Police Department Detective Jeff Ruetz and this reporting supervisor re-interviewed Robert KIRGIS. He was asked several more questions about the subjects of the Columbine High School investigation.

Details:

- 1) On the date of May 4, 1999 at 1320 hours, Denver Police Department Detective Jeff Ruetz and this reporting supervisor re-interviewed Robert KIRGIS. This interview took place at the Luther's Bar-B-Q restaurant located at 11353 West Colfax Avenue. This re-interview was subsequent to a telephonic contact made to KIRGIS by this reporting supervisor in the AM. KIRGIS again, stated that he had "no problem" speaking with investigators about the investigation.
- 2) KIRGIS was asked about the subject Phil Duran, and related that according to Billy Dao, who told KIRGIS, law enforcement searched the residence of Duran and took a few items, but left marijuana there, or didn't find it. Duran's girifriend Christina LNU, told Dao this information and that "the cops were watching the house", and she was "scared." On the day of the Columbine High School shootings, KIRGIS "ran into" Billy Dao at the 7-11 store (Wadsworth & Coalmine), about 1:20 or 1:30 PM. They had a short conversation about what was occurring at the high school. They both agreed to go to KIRGIS' apartment. While there, they smoked a joint of marijuana, and watched the news reports about the incident. But, prior to going to the apartment, KIRGIS remembered he stopped by "4 Your Agency" printing and spoke with "Carol" about something that he didn't recall. KIRGIS stated that he really believed that Eric Harris and Dylan Kleboid were the gunmen, because as he states, "I put all the circumstances together, and it made sense that it happened." KIRGIS and Billy Dao kept watching television until he had to leave to pick up his daughter at Powderhorn Elementary School at about 2:45 PM. This school is located at West Coalmine & South Simms Street. Billy Dao left when KIRGIS left. According to KIRGIS, Phil Duran paged Billy Dao when Dao was present at his apartment this day, and Dao then returned the call to Duran. Duran was on his cellular telephone at the time, and it was about a twominute conversation. KIRGIS recalled that the time of the call was approximately between 1:15 and 1:30 PM. Dao related to KIRGIS that Duran told him if he had heard what was going on at Columbine. Also, Duran asked Dao if he knew where his (Duran's) brother was, he was worried about him. KIRGIS could not recall Duran's

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brother's name but did recall that he had worked for him at Blackjack pizza for just a few days "a long time ago."

3) When KIRGIS was asked about recently seeing or hearing about or from the stated that it "wouldn't surprise him if the was found to be more involved with explosives or the Columbine thing." "I consider the a friend, the other two (Harris & Klebold), just acquaintances." KIRGIS could not recall ever hearing any other names of associates with the subjects of this investigation.

This ended the interview, time was 1420 hours.

Statement of Christopher Lau, Owner, on behalf of Blackjack Pizza

The following statement is an attempt to answer the questions most commonly asked of us by the news media in relation to the Columbine High School tragedy.

Blackjack Pizza is a franchise pizza delivery and carryout operation with no facilities for sit-down dining.

I can confirm that both Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold were employees of the Blackjack Pizza located at 6657 West Ottawa Place, Littleton, CO. I took ownership of this unit March 8, 1999, approximately six weeks before the terrible and tragic events at Columbine High School took place. Harris and Klebold were remined as employees when the change in ownership took place. They were employed as cooks. Among their duties were pizza-making, order-taking and customer service. They did not deliver pizzas at anytime. They worked three to five nights a week, from approximately 4 or 5 PM until approximately 8 or 9 PM. They did not always work the same shifts. The last night they worked was Friday, April 16, 1999. Harris and Klebold performed well in all the duties required by their positions. They were never subject to any disciplinary action. Neither Klebold nor Harris gave any indication that they were capable of the horrific acts committed at Columbine High School.

At this time, other than the comments included in this statement, our policy is not to discuss any present or former employees.

We are cooperating with investigators in every way possible and will continue to do so. I have no continuent on the questions being asked by the investigators.

Our hearts and prayers are with the victims of this terrible event, their family members, and their friends, as well as with the students, faculty and staff of Columbine High School. Our prayers also go out to the community. This community has endured an unspeakably tragic event, and it is very reassuring to see such an outpouring of kindness and support as the community tries to heal itself. In the midst of such disconcerting and terrifying events, it is wonderful that we can have our faith in the general goodness of people reaffirmed. Our thanks go out to all the volunteers who have made these difficult times just a little bit easier.

We would also like to thank the police officers and investigators who are working diligently on this case. There is no adequate way to express our gratitude to law enforcement for risking their lives to secure the safety of the Columbine High School students, faculty and staff, as well as that of the community.

- On April 26, 1999 I interviewed Chris Lan (DOB: 9/11/65), 2580 S. York St., Apt. #206, Denver, CO 80210, (303) 777-9338. On March 8, 1999 he began as owner /operator of the Blackjack Pizza, 6657 W. Ottowa Pl., Littleton, CO (303) 978-0600.
- 2. Mr. Lan said that he bought the franchise from Former owner, Bob Kirgis. Lan initially retained some of the same employees except a few who had poor driving records, whom he did not want working as delivery drivers. Among those retained were Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold, who were employed as "insiders", making pizzas rather than delivery. Harris was paid \$7.65 / hour, and Klebold \$ 6.50 / hour.
- Lan described Harris as his best employee, no trouble, and said that he had offered Harris a promotion on Friday April 16 to shift manager. Harris seemed pleased and accepted. Lan described Klebold as "hyper", loud, energetic, a good worker, punctual, no problems.
- 4. Lan said that on Friday April 16, both Harris and Klebold requested cash advances against their earned hours. Harris received a cash advance of \$200, and Klebold received \$120. (On May 28, 1999 I received from Lan the original cash receipts which were signed by Harris and Klebold, and copies of their three payroll checks from March 8 April 18, 1999. These items were booked into JCSO as evidence through Det. Eaton April 29, 1999, Item nos. 10074, 10075).
- The only problem which Lau could recall regarding Harris and Klebold was when he had found them behind the store together, lighting a newspaper on fire.
- 6. Lan said that he had seen both Harris and Klebold wear black "duster" trenchcoats, recalling that they may have had some type of patches on them, but he cannot recall more specifically. He also recalled that they were once visited at work by a teenage girl he recognized on news broadcasts regarding CHS, described as WF, 5'4", long, straight blonde hair (Robyn Anderson?), who was accompanied by another female (no description).
- 7. Two other friends of Harris and Klebold, who had also worked at the store, were Chris Morris and Nate Dykeman. He described Morris as "moody", looked angry, wore a similar black duster, black pants, black T-shirts, and black boots. Lau terminated Morris from his job due to his affiliation with Harris and Klebold.

8. Former owner, Bob Kirgis, had told Lau on April 21, 1999, that he (Kirgis) had previously seen Harris in the store with a pipe bomb.

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INTERVIEW WITH SUSAN AND TOM KLEBOLD

On 04-30-99, at about 1635 hours I responded to Gary Lozow's office in order to interview Susan and Tom Klebold, the parents of Dylan Klebold. Also present for this interview was Sgt. Randy West, Investigator Cheryl Zimmerman and District Attorney Charles Tingle. Stephanie O'Malley and Gary Lozow were present assisting with the representation of the Klebold parents. Sgt. West explained the purpose of our visit was to obtain background information on Dylan Klebold and he asked that the Klebold's provide that information to us.

The Klebold's advised that Dylan Klebold was born 09-11-81, and was a healthy, happy child, who grew to be very bright. They advised that Dylan Klebold was very good at math, was shy, and was well loved by his teachers and peers. There were problems with Dylan. He joined Boy Scouts, won a Pinewood Derby and was a pitcher on a little league team. The Klebold's indicated that Dylan was gentle, and was that way until the day he died.

Mr. Klebold indicated that he and his son were very close and he is very upset with the way that the media has portrayed him. Mr. Klebold said that he has no idea what happened or why and indicated that Dylan was his best friend and that they spent a lot of time together. Mr. Klebold said that he believed that his son had a personality that was very similar to his. Mr. Klebold went on to state that Dylan always had few friends and that he was an easy child and a normal teenager. Mr. Klebold said that Dylan managed himself and his life well and pointed out that he was in a gifted program at Governor's Ranch Elementary, where he had wonderful teachers in his classes. Mr. Klebold indicated that Dylan's transition to junior high school was difficult for him and Mr. Klebold found that to be painful because he knew the issues that Dylan would go through from being in an elementary school to going to junior high school. Mr. Klebold said that he and his wife were not absentee parents and that they were always there for Dylan.

According to Mr. Klebold, Dylan was born at Lutheran Medical Center and went to Governor's Ranch Elementary School, where he was involved in the CHIPS Program between grades three and six. Prior to that, Dylan was in Normandy Elementary or first and second grade. Dylan then went on to junior high school at Ken Caryl and then ended up at Columbine High

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School. In terms of sports, Dylan played soccer when he was in fifth or sixth grade and he also played T-Ball and baseball. Dylan was very competitive, however, he was sensitive. During Dylan's time at Ken Caryl Junior High School, there was no gifted program, however, he did moderately well. Mr. Klebold believed that Dylan had drum lessons, however, does not recall any particular extracurricular activities in junior high school other than baseball. Once at Columbine High School, Dylan became involved in the plays at the school and in particular, worked sounds and lights. Dylan was also a computer assistant and did troubleshooting and assisted with computers. Dylan was described by his parents as "pretty quiet" while attending Columbine High School and stated that Dylan worked at Black Jack Pizza for a while, quit, went to work at Computer Renaissance, and then left there, and returned to Black Jack Pizza, which is where he was working at the time of his death.

When asked about girlfriends, the Klebold's indicated that Dylan didn't exactly have a girlfriend, but would go out with a group of friends which Mr. Klebold described as "group dating." The Klebold's said that Dylan was extraordinarily shy in high shool, however, he did go to the prom with Robyn Anderson. The Klebold's said that Robyn and Dylan studied Calculus together and described Robyn as a very sweet girl and again said that they don't believe that Dylan ever considered Robyn his girlfriend and again pointed out that there were groups of kids that dated together.

When asked about different friends that Dylan had, the Klebold's said that Dylan had a circle of acquaintances and that it wasn't necessarily a specific group, however, several groups of kids that knew each other. The Klebold's described Dylan's friends as quiet and intelligent kids and maybe shy. The Klebold's said that Dylan's friends were definitely not the most popular kids in school. Dylan had three to four close male friends, who they named as Zach Heckler, Nathan Dykeman, and Eric Harris. The Klebold's also said that Dylan had mentioned Chris Morris's name, however, they don't believe that he had ever been at their house. He also mentioned Dylan was involved in the Fantasy Baseball League with Kristin Theibault, and others who had been at the Klebold residence. Mr. Klebold said that Dylan was very involved in the Fantasy Baseball League on the Internet and stated that he had a pretty organized website regarding that. Mr. Klebold said that Dylan would pick players and they would draft different players and they had played for several years. The Klebold's also advised that Dylan was involved in playing Midnight Bowling at Fun-Plex and would play every few weeks with his group of friends.

he Klebold's indicated that they have an older son, Byron, who moved out two and a half years ago and lives in Aurora with

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a male roommate. They provided his phone number of

Mr. Klebold advised that the transition from Governor's Ranch Elementary to Ken Caryl Junior High could be described as from "cradle to reality." Mr. Klebold said that Dylan was sheltered at his classes at Governor's Ranch. The Klebold's perspective is that Dylan seemed well adjusted. Mrs. Klebold then stated the only time she ever saw Dylan cry was once when he came home from school and went to his bedroom. Dylan then took a box of stuffed toys from the closet and buried himself and fell asleep underneath the stuffed toys. Mr. Klebold said that she checked on what the problem was, however, Dylan would never tell her what had caused him to cry. The Klebold's indicated that they monitored everything about Dylan and Mr. Klebold said that based on his own experience, Dylan seemed normal. Mr. Klebold went on to state that he asked Dylan in the past if people were picking on him and Dylan would tell him no, and would point out that he was 6'4" so people wouldn't pick on him, however, Dylan did indicate that people picked on Eric (Harris).

When asked about the relationship between Dylan and Eric, Mr. Klebold indicated that Eric Harris was "a best friend, but not the only friend." When asked where Eric and Dylan spent most of their time, the Klebold's indicated that Eric did not spend very much time at the Klebold residence and that Dylan sometimes spent the night at Eric Harris's house, as well as others. The Klebold's said that even though Dylan spent evenings at different friends' houses, he always attended to his homework. The Klebold's also indicated that he knows that Dylan and his friends socialized on the computer and would play different computer games via the Internet. When asked about Dylan's friends, the Klebold's indicated that they struck them as happy and healthy and that there was a lot of laughter between Dylan and his friends and that they would watch movies and other activities. The Klebold's indicated that Dylan's friends were always nice and polite to them and indicated that they all seemed like laid back kids without social pressures. The Klebold's indicated that Dylan seemed to like the way that he looked and seemed comfortable in talking to anyone. The Klebold's described Dylan's friends, Nate and Zach, as extroverts and Mrs. Klebold said that she had never met Chris (Morris). Mr. Klebold said that he had met Chris and described him as "serious. The Klebold's said that Eric Harris was quieter and they never felt that they knew him very well, however, he was always respectful. The Klebold's said that Dylan had sleep overs at all of the different boys' homes and Klebold said that it sometimes happened every other weekend. Mrs. Klebold said that she believed it was closer to once a month that Dylan slept at one of is friends house.

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When asked specifically about a friend of Dylan's by the name of Joe, the Klebold's indicated that they have a vague recollection and thought that there may be an association with Black Jack Pizza. When asked about Brooks Brown, the Klebold's indicated that Brooks was a friend of Dylan's and Mrs. Klebold indicated that she and Brooks' mother are friends. They also indicated that Brooks used to have a band and that Dylan played the drums in that band. The Klebold's said that Brooks got out the Chips program in the 6th grade and after that Brooks and Dylan were more acquaintances than friends. The Klebold's said that Brooks had his own circle of friends, however, at some point in the last couple of years Brooks and Dylan had become closer. In fact, Brooks and Dylan discussed possibly writing a play together sometime last year. Mrs. Klebold said that she knew that Judy Brown had problems with Eric Harris and knows that there was some sort of a conflict over a snowball being thrown. Mrs. Klebold said that she did not know about the web site information and didn't know about any threats that were allegedly made by Eric Harris against Brooks Brown. Mrs. Klebold said that she does know that Judy Brown did not like Eric Harris, however, she indicated that "Judy doesn't like a lot of people." Mrs. Klebold said that Dylan did nention that there was a problem between Eric and Brooks, however, Dylan liked both of them. Dylan indicated that he was going to stay out of this conflict. The Klebold's thought that this was a normal range of adolescent behavior. The Klebold's also indicated that Nate and Zach wanted the same girl a few months ago and now they're not talking, indicating that this is also within that normal range of adolescent behavior. Mrs. Klebold said that Dylan was tolerant, even tempered, and never talked back.

Mr. Klebold indicated that he and his son, Dylan, did lots of things together and talked a lot. Mr. Klebold indicated that they played sports together and that they also worked on Dylan's car together and built speakers for the car. Mr. Klebold indicated that Dylan also built his own computer and they played chess together. Mr. Klebold said that he got rheumatoid arthritis approximately three years ago and so he had to quit playing sports with his son. Mr. Klebold said that Dylan was a typical adolescent and would have one word answers at times.

Mr. Klebold indicated that he is a Geo Physical Consultant and that he contracts for independent oil and gas companies. Mr. Klebold said that he is often out of the house, however, he has been home a lot in the last year. Mr. Klebold also indicated that he and his wife have purchased income properties to fix up, however, indicated that Dylan did not like to help him in the repairs f their rental properties.

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Mrs. Klebold indicated that she has worked for 20 years in higher education and that she started as a tutor, became a lab assistant, and worked in a GED lab. Mrs. Klebold said that since September of 1997 she trains people with disabilities.

The Klebold's indicated that they have Rockies season tickets, which they split between four families. Mr. Klebold said that usually he and one of his sons will attend these games. When asked how long they have lived on Street, they indicated that they had been there 10 years. The Klebold's indicated that they would drive down to school when Dylan went to elementary and junior high school and then he would drive himself to Columbine High School. When asked about what Dylan's dreams were for the future, they indicated that he wanted to be a computer science major and had been accepted at the University of Arizona. The Klebold's said that they had just gone on a four day trip to the University of Arizona so that Dylan could pick out his dorm room. The Klebold's indicated that Dylan would not like to dwell on decisions and he appeared to feel comfortable with his decision of going to the University of Arizona.

The Klebold's indicated that there was a lot of involvement in Dylan's life, the last month of his life, however, over Passover he seemed a bit sadder.

When asked about Dylan's room and any wall decorations, the Klebold's indicated that they never saw anything unusual in Dylan's room and thought that it was normal for a 17 or 18 year old boy. The Klebold's said that Dylan had a Nine Inch Nails poster and another poster of a woman in a leopard bikini. The Klebold's said that Dylan also had three sports pictures regarding baseball and also had some street signs. Mrs. Klebold indicated that Dylan had a poster of Marilyn Manson and that she asked him about it, and in particular asked him what it meant. Dylan had told her that it didn't mean anything and that he didn't really listen to lyrics of Marilyn Manson music, however, did listen to the music. The Klebold's indicated that Dylan liked Techno music, which Mr. Klebold described as "machine made music." In particular, Dylan liked Ramstien and KMFDM. The Klebold's said that Dylan was learning how to make decisions and they would let him make those decisions if he would explain himself and articulate why he was making the decisions he was making. The Klebold's indicated this was an example of Dylan becoming an adult.

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When asked about guns, the Klebold's indicated that Dylan did have a BB gun when he was 10 to 11 years old. Dylan also

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had a hunting knife and he once had throwing knives when he was a child. Mr. Klebold said that he was anti-gun and anti-concealed weapons permit and said he never saw any fascination of guns from Dylan. Mr. Klebold said that his children knew that he was anti-violent and anti-gun. When asked about whether or not Dylan knew the German language, the Klebold's indicated that Dylan took French for three years and German in the 5th grade, however, did not know of any particular fascination with the German language.

The Klebold's indicated that they're biggest shock was when Dylan and Eric were caught breaking into a car. They indicated that Dylan went into diversion and did very well with it, as did Eric Harris, and they both got out early. The Klebold's indicated that Dylan was angry when he was caught trespassing into the van and he told them that it was innocent, that the van had been parked there and the stuff that they took belonged to a company.

'gt. West asked the Klebold's about the PVC and galvanized pipe in the garage, and Mr. Klebold indicated that he fixes his rental homes up and that there is probably parts of pipes and/or PVC in the garage.

When asked about activities that Dylan was interested in, the Klebold's indicated that Dylan and his friends like to watch videos and that they were like normal teenagers and watched movies, such as action films and comedies. Mr. Klebold indicated that there's a lot of violence in that kind of movies, however, he felt that these are the kind of movies that all kids today are watching, and in particular named James Bond movies, Lethal Weapon, and Matrix. When asked about the video game "Doom," the Klebold's indicated that Dylan played that game all the time. The Klebold's indicated that Dylan did not hid his playing of "Doom" from his parents and that he would play it on the computer over the phone lines.

When asked about the week proceeding April 20, the Klebold's indicated that on Friday night, April 16th, Eric Harris came over to spend the night sometime between 10:00 p.m. and 11:00 p.m. The Klebold's said that they have not seen Eric in about six months at their home previous to that. The Klebold's said that when Eric arrived at their house on Friday night he was carrying a black nylon duffle bag that was "stuffed with something." The Klebold's indicated that it was awkward for Eric to carry this and that he had to use both hands. The Klebold's said that the next morning Eric left sometime between 9:00 a.m. and 9:30 a.m. and that he did not have the black duffle bag with him. The Klebold's also advised that the bed did not look slept

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in, and so they do not know whether or not if Eric slept on the bed or on the couch. Mr. Klebold said he assumed it was a computer in the bag.

When asked about the relationship between Dylan and Eric, they advised that they did not have the impression that anyone was the leader, however, advised on occasion Eric would get mad at Dylan if he "screwed something up."

When asked about Saturday and Sunday, the Klebold's advised that Saturday the 17th was promight and that Dylan was going to the Prom with Robyn Anderson. The Klebold's indicated that Robyn was in New York and did not get home Saturday until 4:30 p.m. and that Dylan may have been a little bit stressed out that Robyn was delayed getting back from New York. The Klebold's said that the limo was supposed to pick them up at 6:00 p.m. at one of the kid's house. The Klebold's said that Robyn Anderson picked Dylan up and that when she arrived there they talked about their future plans with school and the 'lebold's video taped them leaving. The Klebold's said that Dylan and Robyn went to Bella's restaurant in downtown and that there was a total of 12 people in the limousine. The Klebold's said that Eric Harris did not have a date for the prom, but did go to the after prom. Mrs. Klebold said that Dylan arrived home from the prom at about 3:00 a.m. on Sunday morning and she asked him how the prom was. Dylan then showed his mother a flask of Schnapps, however, told her that he did not drink but a little bit. Dylan indicated that the rest of the group was going to breakfast, however, he was tired and he was just going to go to bed.

The Klebold's said that on Sunday they believed that Dylan slept late because he had gotten home so late. Mr. Klebold said that he thought that Dylan was going to be going over to Eric's, however, he is not sure. Mrs. Klebold did say that they were home all weekend long and indicated that they normally have dinner together as a family on Sunday nights, however, cannot remember if they actually did have dinner together on Sunday, the 18th.

Sgt. West asked the Klebold's if they ever saw the black duffle bag again, and Mr. Klebold said that they did not see it again, nor did they look for it. Mr. Klebold said that the last time he was in Dylan's room was approximately two weeks prior to the 20th and that was to turn off the computer which had been left on. Mr. Klebold said he didn't go up to Dylan's room that much. fr. Klebold said he did not believe that Dylan hung out with kids that they didn't approve of, otherwise they would not have

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allowed him to hangout with those type of kids.

When asked specifically about April 20th, the Klebold's indicated that Dylan had bowling on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday mornings and therefore would have had a bowling class at 6:00 a.m. The Klebold's said that they heard Dylan get up and heard him leave the house at about 5:30 a.m. on April 20th. The Klebold's said that they did not actually see him leave, but rather heard him yell out, "Bye" and then heard him leave the residence. Mr. Klebold said that he was home all day long and did not see Dylan again.

Mr. Klebold indicated that on April 20th, between 11:30 a.m. and noon, Nate Dykeman called him on the telephone at his residence. Nate asked Mr. Klebold if Dylan was there and Mr. Klebold said that Dylan was in school. Mr. Klebold said that Nate said he did not want to worry him, however, there had been a shooting at the school and there had been descriptions of he shooters wearing trench coats. Nate also told Mr. Klebold that Dylan was not in class and that he was trying to account for all of the people that he knows who wear trench coats. Mr. Klebold said that he went up to Dylan's room and looked for his coat, however, did not find it. Mr. Klebold said it was a warm day and that he didn't think Dylan would need the trench coat, however, he could not find it in his room. Mr. Klebold said that he then turned on his television and called his wife, who also came home. Mr. Klebold said he then called a family lawyer and said that Dylan may be involved in something at the school. When asked about the "Trench Coat Mafia," Mr. Klebold said that he had heard Dylan mention the "Trench Coat Mafia," and he advised that Dylan told him that the "jocks" called him and his friends that. Mr. Klebold said that Dylan was kind of amused by the name that the "jocks" had given them.

Mr. Klebold said that he also called his son Byron on April 20th, as well as Stephanie who rents their pool house. Mr. Klebold said that Judy Brown also showed up at their residence and shortly after that the police showed up at the residence. Mr. Klebold said that a Lakewood Detective questioned them in a squad car for a short period and then a search was conducted on their residence.

The Klebold's then advised that on Monday, April 19th, Dylan said that he was going to go to dinner with Eric and some 'iends at the Outback restaurant. Dylan indicated that Eric had coupons and that it was also Eric's favorite restaurant. The

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Klebold's said that Dylan left sometime between 6:00 and 7:00 p.m. and got home sometime later that night. Mrs. Klebold said she asked Dylan if he had a good time and he said yes and indicated he had steak for dinner.

We then asked the Klebold's if they had any questions of us, and Mr. Klebold advised that he would like to get a copy of anything that was on the computer or any diary that Dylan may have left. The Klebold's indicated they would like to know about any writings by Dylan to help them understand what had happened on April 20th.

Mr. Klebold also indicated that he noticed that Dylan's voice was "tight" on Friday, April 16th. Mr. Klebold said that he made a mental note to talk to Dylan about this and believes that he may have even mentioned his concern to his pastor. Mr. Klebold said that he did not have a chance to talk to Dylan prior to April 20th.

On 04-20-99, at approximately 1220 my office contacted me to respond to Columbine High School located in Littleton in reference to a shooting situation. Upon arrival at that location. I was directed to respond to which was the address of a possible suspect involved in the shooting inside the school. Three SWAT team members from Sheridan PD, who were identified as Sgt. Tom Bruton, Officer Joe Siskar, and Officer Dan Perry, and I arrived at at approximately 1315 hours. Upon arrival we contacted several people who were identified as Thomas E. Klebold (DOB: 04-15-47) the father of the alleged suspect Dylan Klebold. Also present was Dylan's mother, Susan Y. Klebold, (DOB: 03-25-49), Byron Klebold (DOB: 10-23-78), and Stephanie A. Juenemann (DOB: 10-04-71). Arriving at their residence shortly after my arrival, was Judy E. Brown (DOB: 05-26-49). After contacting the residence we had them exit the residence and we then proceeded to clear the residence for any other possible people hiding within the structure itself. After the residence was cleared 1 spoke with Dylan Klebold's father. Thomas Klebold

Thomas indicated that he does reside at this residence and his phone number is 3 Thomas was aware of the situation at Columbine High School and he, with the a pager number of knowledge of his attorney, Gary Lozow, (303-292-5656) agreed to speak with me about this incident. Thomas gave Dylan's birth date as 09-11-81 and indicated that Dylan did reside at their residence and that he is a senior at Columbine High School. Thomas indicated that he had been home at their residence for the entire day. He indicated that Dylan drove a black BMW with license plate GBZ2636. Thomas indicated his son had left early that morning because of a scheduled early morning bowling class. Thomas did not see Dylan leave the residence so he was not familiar what the clothing Dylan was wearing. Judy went on to state that this incident had been planned and was put on the Internet.

Judy stated that Eric was emailing Brooks talking about building pipe bombs and blowing people up. Judy stated that she took copies of the emails to the Jefferson County Sheriff's people and again spoke with the two people mentioned above. She stated that Eric was threatening the lives of her son and herself

Judy went on to state that approximately two weeks ago Brooks came home and said that Eric explained to him that he is doing fine now and that he (Eric) was just being crazy the past couple of years. Judy indicated that the two had been unfriendly toward each other until this conversation. Judy indicated she may have the case report number issued by Jefferson County in reference to her report she made to them. He was instructed to inform us that the parents were allowed to enter the house to get clothes and then we were secure the residence and have them leave. At this time, Tom, accompanied by myself and Deputy Faubion, entered the residence and obtained some clothing and personal articles for Tom for the next couple of days. After he was finished, Susan came into the residence and did likewise, along with preparing two birds and two cats to evacuate the home. With clothing in hand, along with their pets, the Klebolds left the residence at





SYNOPSIS:

Case filing on juvenile defendants DYLAN SERNET KLEBOLD and ERIC DAVID HARRIS regarding a First Degree Criminal Trespass To A Vehicle, Felony Thefit with a total aggregate value of \$1719.00 and a Criminal Mischief with an aggregate value of \$100 damaged.

On January 30, 1998, at approximately 9:20 p.m., Jefferson County Sheriff's Deputy Timothy Walsh was conducting patrol duties in Deer Creek Canyon Park, 13896 Grizzly Drive. Littleton, Colorado, County of Jefferson, State of Colorado. Deputy Walsh observed a grav 1986 Honda Prelude, Colorado license GBP-2613, parked near the north/west corner of the parking loc. Deputy Walsh reported that two juvenile white males were observed inside the vehicle. Upon approaching the vehicle Deputy Walsh reported he observed the passenger, later identified as Dylan Bennet Klebold and the driver, Eric David Harris, viewing a variety of items from the back seat of the vehicle; including a yellow meter (JCSD Item #1), a black flashlight (JCSD Item #9), and a video control pad (JCSD Item #7). Deputy Walsh reported he could see a "stack of property" located behind the passenger seat. Deputy Walsh reported that Harris them said, "Hey, we better put this stuff in the trunk" and unlatched the trunk from the interior of the car. As Harris exited the vehicle he was sub-requently contacted by Deputy Walsh. Deputy Walsh reported that when he asked Harris ab the property he and Klebold were inspecting, Harris stated, he and Klebold were "messing around" near Deer Creek Canyon Road and Wadsworth Blvd. Harris continued stating they were walking near the parking area when they found the property neatly stacked in the grass.

Initially during the interview, both Harris and Klebold said that they "found" the property near Deer Creek Canyon Road and Wadsworth. Klebold then told Deputy Walsh there was a white van parked at Déer Creek Canyon Road and Wadsworth Blvd. and they broke out the passenger window and stole all the property that was discovered in their possession. After this admission by Klebold, Deputy Walsh asked no additional questions, and Harris and Klebold were taken into custody. Both Harris and Klebold were then transported to the Jefferson County South Sub Station for parental notification.

At approximately 9:37 p.m., Deputy Miller discovered a 1997 GMC van, Colorado license SBA-3094 located facing morth on the north side of Deer Creek Canyon Road about 100 yards west of Hwy 121. Deputy Miller stated that he observed the passenger side window had been broken out and a large rock was observed between the two front seats of the vehicle. Deputy Miller did note that the interior of the vehicle "appeared to be scattered around in disarray. J.C.S.D. Dispatch contacted Westover Mechanical Services, the business name printed on the vehicle. Ricky Becker then responded to Deputy Miller's location.

At approximately 9:45 p.m., Becker advised Deputy Miller that he had parked the vehicle at the location he had discovered the van and went to dinner with a friend. Becker stated he left the vehicle at approximately 8:00 p.m. and was "positive" the vehicle was locked. Becker advised Deputy Miller that the items inside the van appeared to have been disturbed are one through. Becker advised Deputy Miller that due to the condition of the van he would need to conduct an inventory at a later time in order to determine if any property items were missing from within.

Eric Harris's parents, Wayne Harris and Katherine Harris met with Deputy Walsh at the Jefferson County South-Sub Station. Eric Harris was advised his Miranda rights via a written J.C.S.D. Advisement/Waiver form. Both Sric Harris and his parents stated they understood his rights and would agree for Eric Harris to make a statement. Harris stated to Tenuty Walsh that Klebold and he had gone to the parking area on Deer Creek Canyon Harris stated while "messing around" Klebold looked inside a white van, that had been parked next to Harris's vehicle, and saw some property in it. Harris said that Klebold asked him, "Should we break into it and steal it?" Harris stated he initially told Klebold, "Hell no." Harris told Deputy Walsh another car drove into the parking and they got back in Harris's car. Harris stated they remained inside the vehicle for approximately five minutes and discussed if they were going to break into the vehicle or not. Harris stated that they agreed that they would (break into the vehicle). Harris stated that he told Klebold "Yeah. we'll try it." Harris told Deputy Walsh that he stood on Deer Creek Canyon Road while Klebold put on a ski glove onto his left hand and tried to "punch out" the passenger window of the van. Harris said that Klebold tried this "three times" unsuccessfully. Harris stated he then put the right ski glove on his hand and attempted to "punch out" the glass one time. Harris told Deputy Walsh that they decided to get a "rock" from the grassy area of the parking lot. Harris stated that Klebold found a round rock, approximately 10-12 inches in diameter. Harris stated that Klehold was finally able to break out the passenger window with the rock after striking the window approximately seven times. Harris said he again stood watch while Klebold was breaking out the window. Harris said after breaking out the window and the rock fell into the front seat of the vehicle, Harris then cleared the class off of the window. Harris stated he re-entered his vehicle and waited while Klebold removed the property inside the van. Harris stated Klabold put all the property from the vehicle into the back seat of his vehicle, behind the passenger seat. Harris said he estimated that they were in the parking lot for approximately 30-40 minutes, and they were inside the van taking property for approximately 3 minutes. Harris stated once Klaboli had taken the property and gotten back into his car they decided to go to Deer Creek Canyon Park to decide what they were to do with the property, and they were at the park for approximately 3 minutes prior to wing contacted by Deputy Walsh.

Jefferson County Sheriff's Sgt. Phillip Lebeda conducted an interview with Dylan Bennet Klebold and his parents, Thomas Klebold and Susan Klebold. After advising Klebold of his Miranda rights, both Klebold and his parents completed a J.C.S.D. Advisement/Waiver and agreed to make a statement.

Klebold told Sgt. Lebeda that he and his friend, Eric Harris, had traveled to the area of Wadsworth and Deer Creek Canyon Road. Klebold told Sgt. Lebeda that he and Harris had discharged fireworks and broke bottles for about 20 minutes. Klebold said that he and Harris then decided they could break into a vehicle and take stuff from it and "not get caught." Klebold stated that he and Harris attempted to gain entry into the vehicle by striking the passenger side window with their hands. Klebold said after striking the window several times, Harris then went and sat in his car in case they had to "get away fast." Klebold said he picked up a rock approximately 6-8 inches in diameter and struck the window at least four times before breaking the window. Klebold said he then entered the vehicle and took several items from inside the vehicle. Klebold told Sgt. Lebeda that he took, "one brief case, one black pouch, one flashlight, a yellow thing, and a bucket of stuff." Klebold said he then carried these items to Harris's car. Klebold also stated the he was wearing black ski gloves belonging to Harris so no fingerprints would be left. Klebold told Sgt. Lebeda that he had no idea what they were going to do with the stolen property. They then drove to Deer Creek Canyon Park where they were subsequently contacted by Deputy Walsh.

Up completion of the respective interviews Harris and Klebold were transported to the $J. \odot J.D$. Detentions Facility where fingerprints and photographs were taken. Both Harris

and Klerold were subsequently released back into their parents custody, pending filing of criminal charges.

On Tanuary 31, 1998, at approximately 4:45 p.m., Deputy Mark Miller was contacted by Ricky Be. : Ricky Becker told Deputy Miller that he had thoroughly examined his work van and not led several items were stolen from the passenger compartment of the vehicle. Ricky Becker provided Deputy Miller an itemized list of the items he stated were stolen from his vehicle, with a total value stolen of \$1719, and approximately \$100 damage to the passenger side window of the van.



On 04-20-99, I was made aware of the situation at Columbine High School. (See my report 99-7625-B).

On 4-20-99, I prepared a search warrant for Dylan Klebold's residence at the Command I presented this warrant to Judge Henry Nieto, who signed and sealed the warrant. I provided this warrant to Sgt. Pat Woodin at the Command Post for the Columbine incident.

On 4-21-99, I was told by Sgt. Woodin that this search warrant had not been executed and that I was requested to do so. At that time I realized that the out buildings for the residence at a needed to be added to the search warrant. I amended the search warrant and again took it to Judge Henry Nieto, who again signed and sealed the warrant.

Investigator Art Peterson and I took the warrant to the Command Post, where I met with Sgt. Pat Woodin. Sgt. Woodin informed me that the Arapahoe County Sheriff's Department Bomb Team and Lakewood Police lab personnel were at the residence at warrant awaiting our arrival. Sgt. Woodin stated that upon are arrival they would search the house for explosive devices prior to our entry into the residence. We arrived at the rural residence at about 1140 hours. The residence is fenced and Investigator Felsoci had to open the gate at the end of the driveway so that we might enter. Scott Linne, and Deputy Archie Singleton, FBI Special Agent Greg Sexton, and Lakewood Police lab personnel Pat Bohan, and Bob Hille. Upon our arrival with the warrant, these bomb personnel entered the unlocked residence at the purpose of taking photographs prior to removing those objects. Arapahoe County Bomb personnel then exited the residence with Lakewood lab personnel and prepared to remove the devices, which they did successfully, placing them into their bomb trailer and removing

them from the scene. Sgt. John Hicks arrived for the purpose of assisting with the computers located within the residence.

We then entered the residence and began our search, removing numerous items from the residence. (See attached evidence sheets). Sgt. John Hicks checked two computers on the main level of the residence. Additionally, he also checked and seized three computers from Klebold's room. (See Sgt. Hicks' report for details).

All items recovered from the residence were secured within our vehicle. Lakewood lab personnel provided their film to me. Upon completion of the search, we secured the residence, leaving a copy of the search warrant and inventory of items taken on a small hall desk on the main level of the residence. We then left the property, at about 1530, as did Deputy Mike DeNuzzi, who had relieved Deputy Tim Walsh. (See their reports for exact times of personnel in and out of the scene). We returned to the Tefferson county Sheriff's Office, where we placed the items seized into the evidence vault.

Item #405 included miscellaneous paperwork which had also been collected from Dylan Klebold's bedroom, and previously copied on 04-22-99, by myself (see attached).

Item #407 is an 8mm tape which was viewed by myself on 04-24-99.

tem #408 includes three micro cassette tapes. I listened to these tapes. One was a broken tape, one had what appeared to be sound effects, and the other had one side of a conversation with an unknown male (which was very faint and I could not understand).

Item #409 included a micro cassette which I listened to, and was blank.

Item #410 included a box of shotgun shells which had a sticker on it. I set a lead through the Rapid Start Program reference this item.

Item #415 is a metal hollow tube which appeared to be a silencer. I set a lead through the Rapid Start Program reference this item.

Item #425 included recordable CD's, computer disks, and two Tasco scopes. I set a lead through the Rapid Start Program reference these items. Also included were miscellaneous papers which I copied (see attached).

Item #435 also included computer disks and was taken from Dylan Klebold's bedroom. I set a lead through the Rapid Start Program reference this item.

Item #438 included an unknown electrical component with the brand name of "Cardinal", model #14400V32BIS serial #740013, with a metal tag reading "property of Burger and Company 00063" attached to it. I set a lead through the Rapid Start Program eference this item.

Item #439 included several papers which I had previously copied on 04-22-99 (see attached).

Item #442 was another piece of paper which was taken from Dylan Klebold's bedroom, and appears to be hand signals. I had previously copied this item on 04-22-99 (see attached).

Item #444 was a black nylon bag, inside of which was a piece of paper which read "Vodka" and contained a pocket PC reference, pens, and a PC games subscription card.

Item #445 included seven videotapes which I viewed on 04-24-99, with FBI Special Agent John Elvig. Included in that was a "Nine Inch Nails" video.

Item #449, taken from the closet of Dylan Klebold's bedroom, is a glass jar containing a black colored powder. I set a lead through the Rapid Start Program reference this item.

Item #459 included white tablets within a plastic tube. I set a lead through the Rapid Start Program reference this item.

At this time, I set aside several evidence item numbers to be photocopied at a later date as the copier ceased to function. These include evidence items #405, #439, #442, #447, #417, #428, and #424.
