It is therefore ordered that said defendant shall next appear before this court at 9:00 A.M. on 3-15, 2005, and said defendant may be released from custody upon the execution of an appearance bond in the amount of \$ 10,000.00 conditioned upon the appearance of defendant before this court when ordered.


The court finds that additional conditions of release are necessary to reasonably assure the appearance of said defendant and imposes the following additional conditions:

- No contact with the victim or State's witnesses. Pre-trial Services with electronic monitoring device.
- No contact with anyone under the age of sixteen without authorized responsible adult being present.

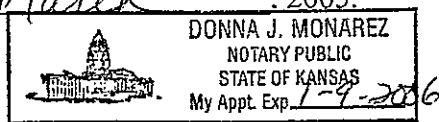
